This installation requires:

- Lowering of the spare tire
- Fishwiring to install hardware
- Temporary ground cable removal, if applicable

Periodic inspection of the trailer hitch should be performed to ensure all mounting hardware remains tight and structural components are secure.

To help prevent damage to the product or vehicle, refer to the specified torque specifications when securing hardware during the installation process.



ASSEMBLY


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FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE

Insert coiled end of fishwire tool through hitch mounting hole in vehicle frame rail and out the access hole. Pass coiled end of fishwire through spacer and thread bolt into coil. Kink wire to keep spacer separate from bolt as shown. Pull fishwire, spacer and bolt through frame and out mounting hole. Use fishwire to guide hitch during mounting and prevent loss of bolt or spacer inside frame rail.



Step 1

If present, using a 10mm socket, remove the grounding cable from the rear of the passenger-side frame rail. Return the fastener to vehicle owner.

Lower the spare tire for installation.




Step 2

If present, pull out the harness plug from the driver-side frame rail.



Step 3

For the rearward most holes, tape a U-shaped spacer (#1) into the recess in the frame.



Step 4

Fishwire (#5) two 5/8" carriage bolts (#3) and square-hole spacers (#2) through either an access hole or the end of the frame. Leave the hardware in the frame with the fishwires attached. Repeat on the other side.



Step 5

Raise the trailer hitch into position and pull the fishwires so the carriage bolts are in their final position. Remove the fishwires carefully and loosely install the supplied 5/8" serrated-flange nuts (#4).

If removed in Step 1, reinstall the grounding cable with the provided M8 flange bolt (#6).

If removed in Step 2, push the harness plug into the 1" hole on the hitch plate on the driver side.



Step 6

Torque all 5/8" fasteners to 180 lb-ft.

Raise the spare tire back into position.
